Advising is a teaching and learning experience in which you set educational goals, learn to navigate your college experience, and make plans to achieve your next steps. Advisors can connect you to a network of resources and support services and teach you how to find information to make the most out of your college experience.

STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

- Take Initiative to set up meetings with your advisor, come with questions, check your Highline email regularly and follow-up with your advisor on any recommendations.
- Examine and attempt to clarify your interests,
 values and goals as you define your educational goals and develop your academic plan.
- Be willing to share what you discover. This does not mean all of your questions or ideas must be perfectly formulated. This is a learning process.
- Develop an academic plan, including long-term and short-term goals, that takes into account your interests, values and goals while ensuring timely academic progress toward your Highline degree.
- Take primary and increasing responsibility for your academic decisions. Your higher education requires choosing between many different possibilities. You are developing your critical thinking and navigation skills.

ADVISOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- They will create a reflective, supportive, and safe environment for you to communicate, think aloud, and explore academic ideas.
- They will share with you several ways you can easily reach them.
- They will focus your questioning and inquiry in refining and improving your learning both about yourself and your engagement at Highline, while respecting who you are and where you come from.
- They will support the final decisions you make about your higher education even if those decisions are at odds with their professional opinion or judgment.
- They will advocate for your best interests within the structure of Highline.
- They will stay current with Highline degree requirements, academic programs and policies, and campus resources, and make useful referrals to other departments and offices as necessary.

SAMPLE QUESTIONS FOR YOUR ADVISOR

Academic advising is a process in which both the student and the advisor share responsibility. In actively participating in the process, you should be prepared to ask your advisor questions. The following questions are sample questions for you to consider when preparing for academic advising appointments.

How can I...

- decide on a program of study that matches my interests?
- drop or withdraw from a class?
- succeed in classes and improve my GPA?
- determine the classes I should take each quarter?
- have transfer credits approved prior to taking the class?
- find scholarships and internships?
- figure out what to do after Highline?

Where do I...

- go for tutoring?
- go if I have a disability?
- get help with wellness and managing stress?
- find course equivalencies for my transfer credits?

What is...

- the difference between AA, AS, AAS?
- a permission number and how do I get one?

Who can...

- assist me with my study skills, time management, and test-taking skills?
- talk with me about personal issues that are affecting my studies?
- process a late drop/add or late withdrawal?
- help me review my resume and/or personal statement for transfer/scholarships?
